

Lappeenranta

Lappeenranta has been growing at the intersection of eastern and western cultures for centuries. Lappeenranta was granted the rights of a city in 1649. The best example of both Swedish and Russian influences may probably be found in the oldest part of the city: the Fortress.

A train ride from Vainikkala railway station to St. Petersburg only takes an hour and a half. The Nuijamaa border crossing point is situated some 30 kilometres from Lappeenranta.

Each summer, the largest sandcastle in Finland is built near the Fortress at the tip of Cape Linnoitusniemi.

Imatra

In the summertime, one may marvel at the foams of Finland's oldest tourist attraction, the Imatrankoski Rapids, in special rapids shows. There is also a grand castle hotel that stands by the rapids. The Imatrankoski Rapids, surrounded by Finland's first national park, are even mentioned in the Kalevala. Furthermore, there are two spas in Imatra.

Parikkala

The internationally renowned collection of outsider art in the Parikkala Sculpture Park is an interesting destination along Main Road 6. Siikalahti is Finland's most precious bird lake and it is an interesting hiking destination for bird watchers, nature photographers and families alike. Kitee

Tohmajärvi

The municipality is characterised by forested hills and large mires. The grove zone of Lake Ladoga is very lush and impressive.

The main cultural attraction is the region's oldest wooden church in Kirkkoniemi, dating back to 1756. The location has been called the most beautiful spot for a church

in Finland. Via the international border crossing at Niirala you can get quickly over the border into wonderful Russian Karelian scenery. Please note that EU citizens require a visa to travel to Russia.

Joensuu

Joensuu is the provincial capital of North Karelia, situated on the northern shore of Lake Pyhäselkä at the mouth of Pielisjoki River, and it is the second largest city in Eastern Finland by population. The city's atmosphere is created by the Pielisjoki River that runs through the city centre and the diverse service offering found there – not to forget the market square and the hustle and bustle of Karelian life. There are seven bridges that cross the river within city limits. The cityscape is commanded by the city hall designed by Eliel Saarinen and completed in 1914

Ilomantsi

lomantsi is known for its happy people, as well as its location as the easternmost continental municipality in Finland and in the EU. Ilomantsi has many sites of military history, and our national epic Kalevala comes alive here. The Orthodox faith is very prominent in Ilomantsi. The region is known for wilderness, apex predators and Karelian culture.

Hospitality, folklore, kantele music and traditional dishes are important parts of the rich Karelian heritage. Ilomantsi has the largest wooden Orthodox church in Finland. Many memorials mark the battle sites of the Second World War.

Lieksa

Lieksa is located between Lake Pielinen and the Russian frontier. The main attractions are Koli and Ruunaa rapids. The peaks of Koli are remnants of a mountain chain, millions of years old. The views from Koli are central imagery of Finnish national romanticism.

One can immerse themselves in history at the Pielinen Museum, the second largest outdoor museum in Finland, situated near the Lieksa city centre, as well as in the Monola Granary where composer Jean Sibelius and his wife Aino spent their honeymoon. Vuonisjärvi offers the atelier of sculptor Eva Ryynänen and the beautiful wooden Paateri Church.

The only White Karelian (Viena) villages in Finland are in Suomussalmi: Kuivajärvi and Hietaiärvi.

Suomussalmi is also famous for many battle sites of the Winter War, mainly the Raate Road.
